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EXAMINATION TIPS !!!

Assessment is an essential component of education. It is the process of determining how much a student understands based on the lesson taught in class. It allows students to see how they are progressing in class. It is the collection of various data from various sources to assess the student's learning and comprehension. It assists the teacher in effectively planning lessons. It serves as a road map for the teacher to determine whether or not all of the objectives set out at the start of the lesson have been met.

Assessment will help students learn more effectively. It affects grades, placement, progress, educational needs, and curriculum decisions. It is a valuable tool for developing curriculum and teaching approaches based on the needs of students. It is also useful in determining the overall effectiveness of programs and revising classroom practices.



Preparing for an exam can be stressful at times when we have a lot to study but restricted period of time. While few students having a proper study plan studies better and faster but many others end up studying less and stressing more about the outcome of the exam.

Let me share few simple steps to ease the pressure of examination:

1. Allot enough time for study.

Study is a major priority in higher classes. While 6 hours may be too much for one student, it may be what is necessary for another. Therefore, you must examine your own needs and then allot your time appropriately.

2. Make use of your free hours between classes.

If your schedule permits, the hours between classes can be used to review notes before a class or to begin an assignment.

3. Study at the same time daily.

Having specific hours set aside each day will maintain the systematic organization of your schedule and keep you actively involved in studying.

4. Schedule a weekly review.

Plan to review each classes' notes from the beginning to end once a week. This only takes a short time and will reduce the amount of study time needed before an exam.

5. Schedule daily reviews.

Spend 15 - 20 minutes reviewing your notes immediately following class or when classes are done for the day. Again, this will reduce the amount of study time needed before an exam.

6. Account for project time.

Remember to allow an appropriate amount of time during the course of the week for long-term projects (i.e., papers, group projects, journals, etc.)

7. Allow for flexibility.

Although your schedule should be very systematic, you should allow for some flexibility. It is important not to over schedule thus allowing for a variety of "non-academic" activities.

Read early and read often.



The early years are critical to developing a lifelong love of reading. It's never too early to begin reading to your child! The tips below offer some fun ways you can help your child become a happy and confident reader. Try a new tip each week. See what works best for your child.

- Read together every day. Read to your child every day. Make this a warm and loving time when the two of you can cuddle close.
- Give everything a name. Build your child's vocabulary by talking about interesting words and objects. For example, "Look at that airplane! Those are the wings of the plane. Why do you think they are called wings?"
- Say how much you enjoy reading. Tell your child how much you enjoy reading with him or her. Talk about "story time" as the favorite part of your day.
- Read with fun in your voice. Read to your child with humor and expression. Use different voices. Ham it up!
- Know when to stop. Put the book away for awhile if your child loses interest or is having trouble paying attention.
- Be interactive. Discuss what's happening in the book, point out things on the page, and ask questions.
- Read it again and again. Go ahead and read your child's favorite book for the 100 time! Talk about writing, too. Mention to your child how we read from left to right and how words are separated by spaces.
- Point out print everywhere. Talk about the written words you see in the world around you. Ask your child to find a new word on each outing.
- Get your child evaluated. Please be sure to see your child's pediatrician or teacher as soon as possible if you have concerns about your child's language development, hearing, or sight.

FEAR!!!

Fear is the single biggest thing that holds us back. Overcoming fear is an essential step in achieving our goals and dreams.

“Do the thing you fear and the death of fear is certain.” – Ralph Waldo Emerson

It's one of most common reasons people procrastinate on taking action toward their goals. We fear failure, or rejection, or being embarrassed, or disappointing or angering other people, or getting hurt.

So we play it safe and avoid taking risks or trying new things. That's why today, I'm going to provide you tips and strategies for overcoming fear and overcoming negative thoughts with ease.



7 Strategies for Overcoming Fear

1. Become More Aware of Your Thoughts

Thoughts produce emotions – so if you want to change how you feel, change your thoughts. Whenever you feel fear, retrace your mental steps and observe what you were thinking. What thoughts led to your feelings of fear? Once you identify them, it will be easier to resolve them.

2. Choose More Positive Thoughts

You can't rid yourself of negative thoughts simply by not thinking them. The Law of Replacement dictates that you can't replace something with nothing – you have to replace it with something else. So when you notice yourself experiencing a negative, fear-producing thought, replace it with a positive thought instead.

3. Notice the Physical Effects of Fearful Thoughts

Observe the physical sensations you experience when you think a fearful thought. You may feel fear as a sinking feeling in your stomach, a tightening in your shoulders and chest, or an elevated heart rate.

Notice what you feel and then consciously replace them with sensations you'd rather be experiencing.

Focus on how positive emotions, such as peace and joy, show up in your body – as a rush of warmth. Imagine yourself experiencing those sensations instead, and your fears will be neutralized.

4. Use Positive Affirmations

Utilize affirmations to create a more positive, success-oriented mindset. Affirmations are powerful statements that describe the reality you want to create – and they are a powerful antidote to fear.

5. Charge Your Visualizations with Powerful Positive Emotions

Take this affirmation for example:

“I am so happy and grateful now that I am a good student.”

When you include a positive emotion in the statement – such as happiness or gratitude – you open yourself to experiencing that emotion in your body, giving your affirmation far more impact.

Just as the emotion of fear can paralyze you, intense positive emotions can motivate you toward greater success.

6. Be Realistic About Risk

A practical – and often overlooked – strategy for overcoming fear is to make sure you're not risking more than you can afford to lose.

7. Celebrate Your Successes

You've overcome countless fears to become the person you are today, whether it was learning to ride a bicycle or performing on stage. Taking risks and opening yourself to new experiences is always a little scary.

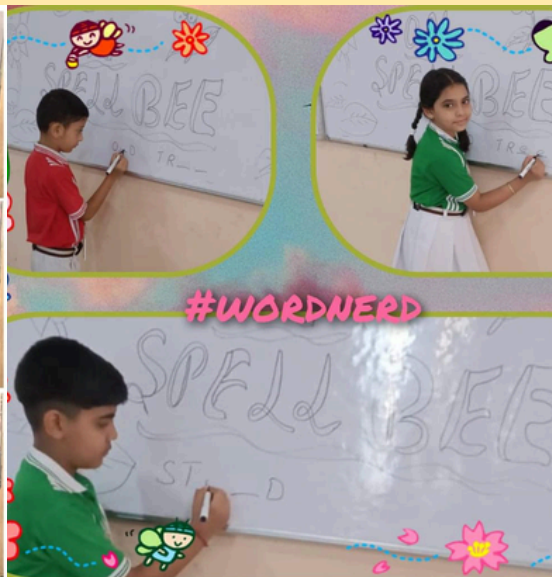
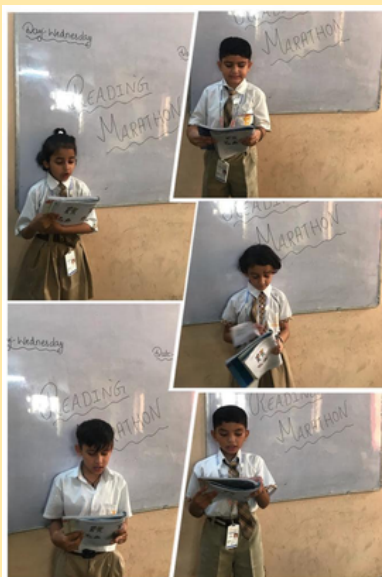

WRITING SKILLS



WHAT ARE WRITING SKILLS?

- When we talk about writing skills, we are referring to your ability to provide the reader with all the relevant information that they will need in a clear and concise manner that can be easily understood.
- Someone who has good writing skills will be easily able to put their message across in a piece of writing that is grammatically correct and interesting, captivating the reader and causing them to want to read more.

TIPS FOR IMPROVING YOUR WRITING SKILLS

SPELLING AND GRAMMAR

- Including a good level of spelling and grammar in your writing shows that you have paid attention to what you are doing. It is important to use a tool such as a spellchecker to ensure that there are no mistakes in the text. On top of this, good grammar not only makes your writing look and sound more professional, but it also allows the reader to understand it better.
- For example, if you were to make the smallest grammatical mistake such as using the wrong verb in a sentence, it can make it much more difficult to understand. Think about the following sentence "My sister likes fish so she ran to the shop to buy some." If the verbs in this sentence were not correct, it might sound more like this "My sister likes fish so she **runned** to the shop to **buy** some." You can see that the second example does not sound right and can make your writing sound sloppy.

READ MORE

- One of the best things that you can do to improve your writing skills is to read more. By doing this you are ingraining a good knowledge of writing into your mind and it gives you the chance to learn from published and professional authors who have some of the greatest skills in the world.
- On top of this, by reading you will also be able to pick out mistakes in other people's work which will then translate into making less of your own mistakes. You will also be able to learn new vocabulary and learn more about different writing styles.

PRACTISE

- It doesn't matter whether you are writing an important essay or making some notes in a personal journal, you are still writing and this is so important to do every day if you want to improve your writing skills.
- Putting pen to paper every day will not only create an excellent routine but will also give you the opportunity to practise and hone your skills, causing you to improve every single day.

OUTLINE YOUR WORK

- Before you begin writing, it is very important to have a clear outline of what you are going to write. This will allow you to build up a picture which you can follow as you write, avoiding any unnecessary text and keeping the piece of writing on track from beginning to end.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- When writing, it is important that you consider your audience. Unless you are writing a technical manuscript that will be read by people who will understand the jargon and technical phrases, you should keep your wording simple and easy to understand. This will make your writing appeal to more people and will help you to get your point across much more easily.

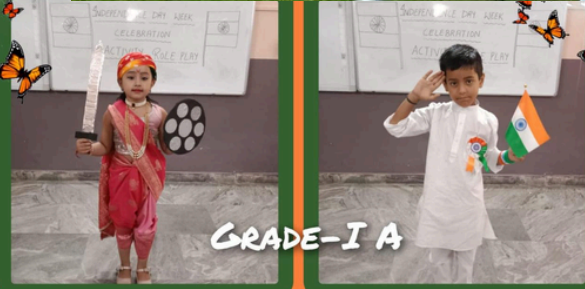

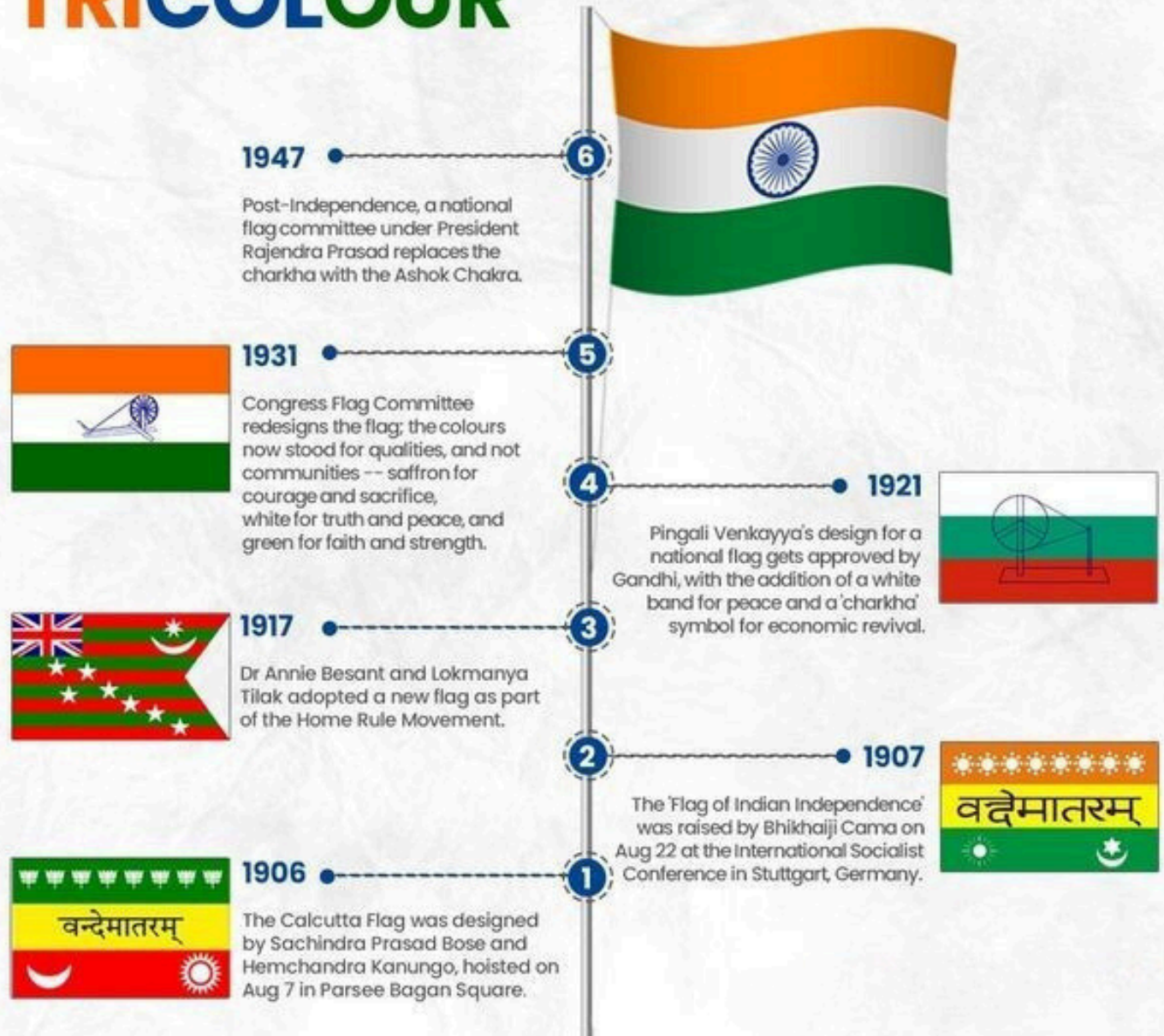

The main motive of conducting this competition was to give students a healthy platform to learn spellings in different ways. Such competitions help students improve their spellings, increase their vocabulary, learn concepts, and develop the use of correct English.

Kriti Singh, student of Grade X, hosted this competition along with other members named Agrini Angral, Lakshita and Sehrish Javed. A total number of 20 students earnestly participated in the competition.



Science Exhibition themed "ECO-INNOVATION"

Our students participated in Science Exhibition themed "ECO-INNOVATION" under the Patronage of Jammu Sahodaya schools complex at R.M. Public School.

To motivate the modern youth that science and technology are essential instruments for achieving self-reliance in social economic development, our students prepared two working models, one from junior group and one from senior group.

Our students from junior group have prepared an eco-friendly revolutionary gravity battery project by using recycled and sustainable materials. And students from senior group have prepared an eco-friendly converting of waste into electricity project by using sustainable materials.

Junior wing-Gravity battery model

The students have tried to showcase the importance of sustainability in Energy storage. We have heard about solar cell batteries, solar panels etc but this is something new. They have made a GRAVITY BATTERY MODEL and this battery is more efficient than any other battery to generate clean and green electricity.

A gravity battery works by using excess energy (usually from sustainable sources) to raise a mass to generate gravitational potential energy, which is then lowered to convert potential energy. One form of a gravity battery is one that lowers a mass, such as a block of concrete, to generate electricity.

Gravity batteries last longer than other usual lithium ion batteries and are also better for environment. Gravity batteries work by using power from renewable energy sources.

The gravity battery used here is a viable solution to the global energy storage challenge. Utilizing the force of gravity, these batteries store excess energy from renewable sources and convert it into electricity when required. They have longevity, are easily repairable, and have a lower environmental impact. This is all about the Gravity Battery Cell.

Senior wing-Conversion of waste into Electricity

The students have tried to showcase the importance of clean and green energy from waste material. So, the model works like this. Firstly, combustion takes place in a box which is also known as

Turbine. This indirect approach to generation currently has an efficiency of around 15-27%, albeit with the lot of potential for improvements. Whether any approach to generating electricity from waste can be considered sustainable depends on the net calorific value of the waste is going into the process. Due to the combustion of non-biodegradable waste there is a possibility that many greenhouse gases can be produced. So, to fight with this problem we have condensation as a means of gas purification is of interest primarily for the removal of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) from exhaust gases. The process consists of cooling the gas stream to a temperature at which the organic compound has a suitably low vapour pressure and collecting the condensate and then releasing them as non-harmful and purified gases.

The purification of carbon dioxide is considered harder as compared to other greenhouse gases. For this, we have used a carbon collecting plate for the collection of carbon which is further utilised for fertiliser production, natural gas production etc.

It is critical to educate people and encourage them to practise Recycle, Reuse and Reduce instead of producing waste. Waste disposal should be a priority for municipalities and governments. Rather than sending residual waste direct to landfill, advanced conversion technologies coupled with advanced pollution control systems can be employed to convert these calorific materials into clean energy. Sweden was the first country which was already using this technology. Now it's high time that India should also adopt this technology.

International Literacy Day

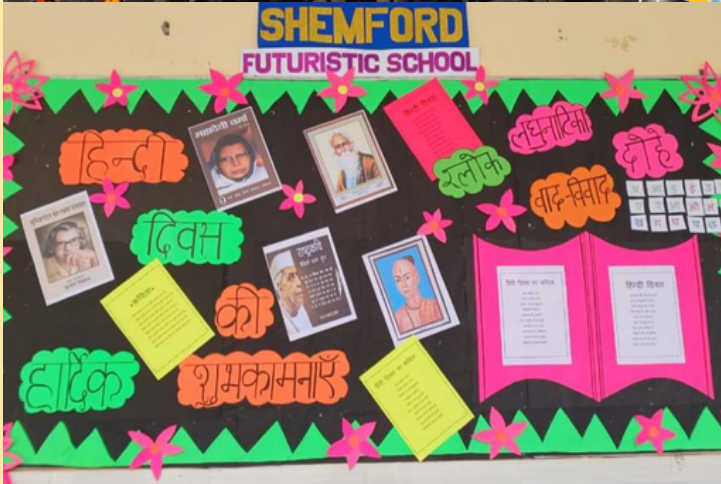

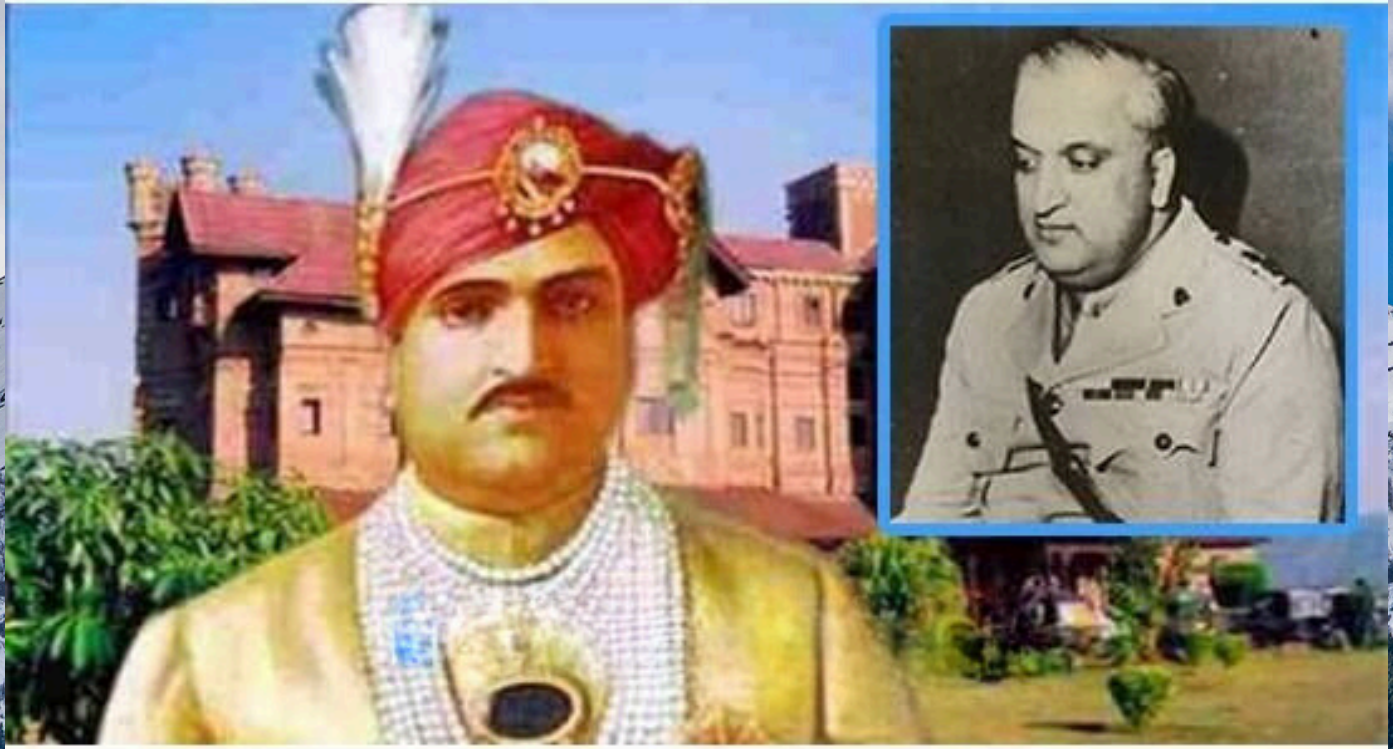

Remembering The last secular ruler of princely state of Jammu and Kashmir



Hari Singh Ji was the last ruling Maharaja of the princely state of Jammu and Kashmir in India. He completed his education from Mayo College in Ajmer. After Mayo College, He went to the British-run Imperial Cadet Corps at Dehra Dun for military training. Following the death of his uncle Pratap Singh in 1925, Hari Singh ascended the throne of Jammu and Kashmir. In 1947, after India gained independence from British rule, Jammu and Kashmir had the option to join either India or Pakistan or to remain independent. But when Pakistan invaded Jammu and Kashmir. Hari Singh decided to join INDIA and signed the Instrument of Accession on 26 October 1947, joining the whole of his princely state (including Jammu, Kashmir, Northern Areas, Ladakh, Trans-Karakoram Tract and Aksai Chin) to the Dominion of India.

Maharaja Hari Singh's legacy as a ruler of a vast and diverse kingdom who loved his land and all his people is something we need to know and learn from.

Chhath Puja is a famous Hindu festival celebrated every year in the month of November and it falls on the 6th day of diwali. It is mostly celebrated in Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and many other parts of India.

Two days before Chhath Puja, the tradition of bathing and eating begins. Pumpkin curry and rice are made in the form of bhog for offering to the lord on this day.

The second tradition of Chhath Puja is Kharna.

Those who observe fast on Kharna day i.e. Kartik Shukla Panchami (Labh Panchami) do not consume salt and sugar.

In the evening after the Surya Puja, the devotees prepare kheer made of rice and sugarcane juice, make the bundle of the kheer in a cloth and offer it to Lord Surya.

This day is the most important day of the Chhath festival. On this festival the devotees make khajoor, thekua and puri for bhog. On this day, the devotees who observe the fast go to a holy river or lake with their families and offer Arghya to Surya Dev. Then they offer fruits, flowers and oil lamps to the water in the presence of Lord Surya.

Chhath Puja ends on Kartik Shukla Saptami.

On this day, the devotees who observe the fast visit the lake or riverside early in the morning and offer Arghya to the rising sun. This marks the end of the Chhath fast and the devotees break their fast by drinking Sharbat.

अर्थ: ना दान है ना सुशीलता है ना कीर्ति है ना सेवा है ना दया है तो ऐसा जीवन क्या है?

8. यथा चित्तं तथा वाचो यथा वाचस्तथा क्रिया: !

चित्ते वाचि क्रियायांच साधुनामेकूपता !!

अर्थ: साधु जन वही बोलते हैं जो उनके चित्र में होता है और जो उनके चित्र में होता है वही उनकी क्रिया में होता है। ऐसे साधु जन के मन वचन एवं क्रिया में समानता होती है।

9. यस्तु सञ्चरते देशान् सेवते यस्तु पण्डितान् !

तस्य विस्तारिता बुद्धिस्तैलबिन्दुरिवाम्भसियस्तु सञ्चरते देशान् सेवते यस्तु पण्डितान् !

तस्य विस्तारिता बुद्धिस्तैलबिन्दुरिवाम्भसि।।

अर्थ: वह व्यक्ति जो भिन्न-भिन्न देशों में भ्रमण करता है एवं विद्वानों की सेवा करता है ऐसे व्यक्ति की बुद्धि उसी तरह बढ़ती है जैसे तेल की बूंद पानी में फैल जाती है।

10. शतेषु जायते शूरः सहस्रेषु च पण्डितः ! वक्ता दशसहस्रेषु दाता भवति वा न वा !!

अर्थ: 100 लोगों में एक शूरवीर होता है, हजार लोगों में एक पंडित(विद्वान) होता है, 10000 लोगों में वक्ता होता है, लाख लोगों में एक दानी होता है।
